

What Lies Beneath?

Year 3 Learning Booklet | Summer 1



HOOK

The children start their topic by discovering that characters from this half term's rich read have recently visited Year 3's shared area and have left behind clues about themselves. On their hook day, the children start a police investigation into the book's storyline.

The children also learn how to draw a cartoon crocodile that will feature in their outcome.

MAIN FOCUS

- English where the children will write a non-chronological report based upon the Krindlekrax.
- DT where the children will explore linkages and levers in order to make a moving model of the Krindlekrax.
- Computing where the children will use 'Google Slides' to create an animation that features the Krindlekrax.
- Geography where the children will learn about the water cycle in order to understand the habitat of the Krindlekrax.

The following are not linked to the topic:

- Science where the children will learn about light and shadow.
- PSHE where the children will learn about how to maintain a healthy lifestyle.
- RE where the children will look at the concept of sacred places.

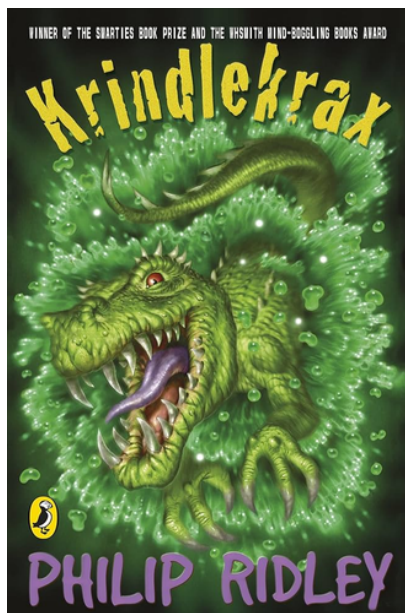
OUTCOME

LEARNING EXPERIENCES

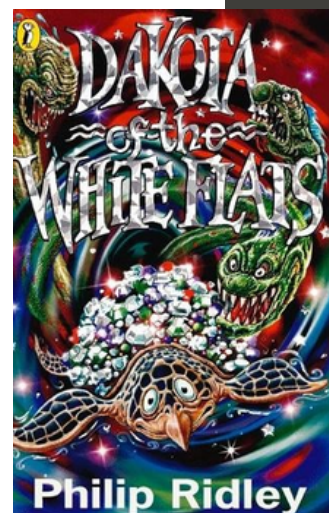
- English: investigating characters and events, reading reports, making predictions, hot seating, justifying opinions.

In Lower School, your child has two weekly home learning tasks:

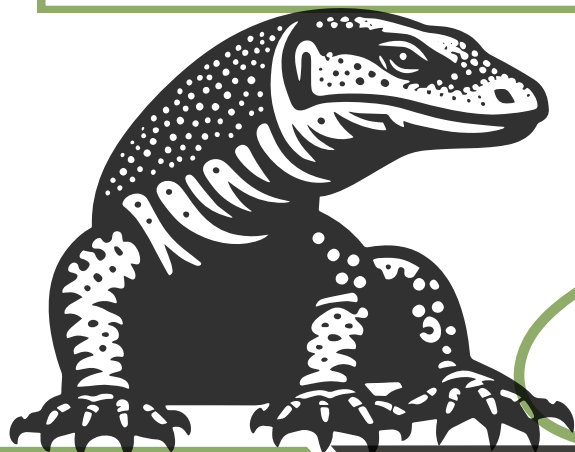
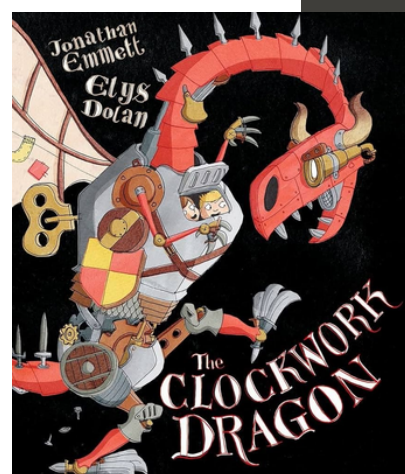
- 1) Reading - due every Tuesday
