Year 5 Learning Newsletter | Autumn Term 1

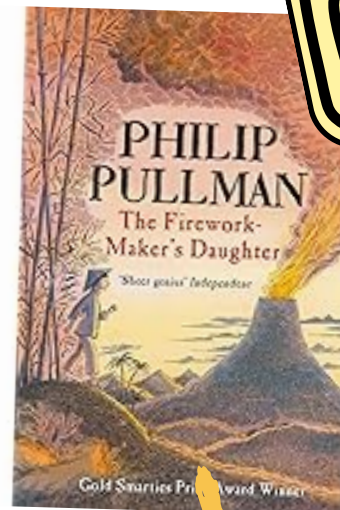
HOOK

The children will start to investigate the character of Lila (the main character from our Rich Read, 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Phillip Pullman). They will use their investigative skills to complete a 'Royal Sulphur Hunt'.

After reading some of the story, the children will create a firework scene and decorate Hamlet (the elephant from the story) using graffiti art.

They will also have the opportunity to try a spring roll – a dish widely eaten in Indonesia – the country where our Rich Read is located.

Rich Read



TOPIC WORDS:

Main Focus

This topic will focus upon:

- **English** where the children will learn to write persuasive letters in role as Lila.
- **Science** where the children will get to investigate different materials that could be used in Lila's workshop.
- **DT** where the children will create their own spring rolls and dipping sauce. They will then refine the recipe for the outcome.
- **Geography** where the children will learn about earthquakes and volcanoes.
- **Art** where the children will learn how to create a watercolour wash as a background for a silhouette of an Indonesian landscape.
- **Computing** where the children will learn how to create a poster using graphics software.

The following are not linked to the topic:

- **PSHE** where the children will explore family relationships, friendships and making people feel included. They will also think about treating people equally and being respectful.
- **RE** where the children will learn about the concept of community (Umma) in relation to Islam.

Learning Experiences

- **English:** exploring character's personalities and motives, hot seating and writing in role as Lila to persuade her father to let her become a firework maker.
- **Science:** conducting experiments to sort and compare materials based on their properties to determine which materials are best suited for different purposes.
- **DT:** adapting a recipe, using cutting, mixing and spreading techniques to cook a savoury dish.
- **Geography:** exploring what causes earthquakes and volcanoes to occur as well as finding out where they are located.
- **Art:** using watercolour wash to create tint, shade and tone. They will also create a silhouette to go in the foreground.
- **Computing:** using image processing skills to create layered images for an advertising poster.

The following are not linked to the topic:

- **PSHE:** role playing scenarios, giving advice and class discussions.
- **RE:** mind mapping, creating posters, class discussions and comparing communities.

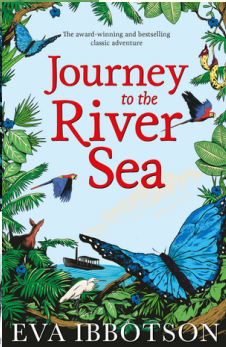
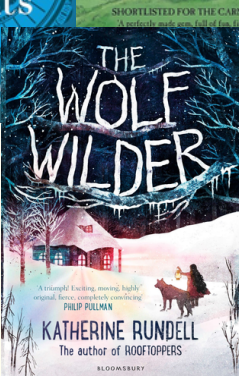
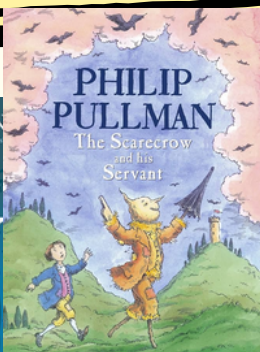
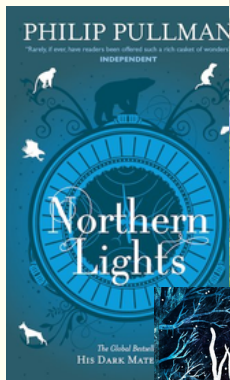
If your child enjoys 'The Firework Maker's Daughter', they may also like these.
