### HOOK

Following an initial taste of the opening chapters of the story, Year 6 will be taken on an exciting 'survival adventure' morning, including orienteering, learning wolf language and exploring the obstacles on Torak's quest.

# **Main Focus**

The children will learn about the art of survival in the outdoor environment, how species adapt to survive in their environment and how to overcome challenges in a 'survival' situation.

The topic will focus on:

- English where the children will study the characters, setting descriptions and journey of Torak and Wolf. They will then write their own survival journey through woods, mountains and rivers.
- Science where the children will learn to classify vertebrates and invertebrates, with a focus on invertebrates. The children will study the human circulatory system and learn to measure heart rate before and after exercise.
- Geography where the children will learn about mountain ranges in the UK and compare these to The Rockies in Canada.
- Computing where the children will plan and then create a maze, through Scratch, for the demon bear to pass through.

The following are not linked to the topic:

- PSHE where the children will look at what creates healthy relationships.
- RE where children will understand the concept of 'Prophecy'.



# Learning Experiences
